#### Walled Garden

We are planning an open day for the first time since covid. It will take place on 7 May. Details are shown in the photograph below.



During the winter we have welcomed 120 children from Roe Green Infants school, who visited the garden They came in four groups of 30. Thanks to Carol and Ann who escorted them round the Garden showing the various animal and insect habitats.

We have now discovered that our large wooden shed - the one at the back by the stumpery - had developed serious rot in the woodwork due to water rising up from the ground. The rot has affected both the floor and the bottoms of the side panels.

Fortunately one of our volunteers, Jim, is a retired craftsman. Jim set about making good the damage by cutting back the rotten sections of the floor of the shed, and also removing the rotted side panels all around the shed. The side panels have now been replaced and Jim is now working on building up the floor area. We believe that with these repairs the shed will have many years life left.

Jim has devoted a lot of his time over the last few years as a volunteer in the garden. He has carried out many repairs to our buildings, repointing the brick walls, laying paving stones and he has restored several antique wooden benches like new.

#### **Fryent Country Park**

Since the beginning of the year the Sunday project team volunteers have completed 17 projects in Park. The Gaderbrook project has now ended with interpretation panels erected – these were designed by Ishaa, Rose and Mireille and we thank them for their beautiful artwork showing nature around the Gadebrook. Thanks also to Maurice for all his hard work on this project.

The young people doing the Duke of Edinburgh Award have contributed much to the projects and are learning new skills including hedge laying.

We were joined by representatives from the Frog Life organisation for a very muddy project on Richards and Honey Slough ponds to smooth the ponds' edges.

## Frog spawn at Fryent Country Park

The common frog is monitored at the Park by counting the clumps of spawn. This indicates the number of adult pairs. 1129 clumps were recorded in 2022 which represents a large population, but nevertheless was only half the quantity recorded in 2021. Frog spawn counts do vary and factors that can affect the common frog include habitat, disease, predation, weather and ponds losing water. We have worked on several ponds along the Gaderbrook stream to improve the ponds' habitats.
